Adult Education Class

On Wednesday evening, October 11, we will begin our Adult Ed sessions for the fall. I have chosen a small book entitled The Illumined Heart: The Ancient Christian Path of Transformation. The book was written by Frederica Mathewes-Green, a Greek Orthodox Christian. I have found it to be an extraordinary text, not only because of its simplicity but because it provides a perspective on our faith that many western Christians may not have or understand. I have long been an advocate of getting back to basics in our spiritual journey and this book speaks to that in an interesting way. Even if you are not going to discuss this book with us on Wednesday evening, I heartily recommend it for your personal spiritual journey. I'd like to meet in the parish hall. It may be more comfortable than the pews in church. If that doesn't work we can always move back to church

Fall Food Drive

In the fall of 2004 we began doing what has become an annual food drive to stock the food pantry at Caritas of Austin. To date our outreach program with Caritas has consisted of this annual food drive along with our once a month assistance with their lunch ministry. In the past two years we have collected nearly two thousand pounds of food for their shelves and it's time for us to get moving again. I keep reading and hearing about the needs of the poor in this city but also about the several outreach ministries that provide help to them. It's a great thing that we are able to be of assistance to Caritas in their outreach to the poor. We are not really in a position to take a leading role in this kind of ministry, so we help where we can. I don't like moving backwards so my goal this year is to surpass the 1038 pounds of food we, as a parish, donated last year. Beginning Sunday, October 1, there will be bags available at the rear of church to make your donations. As in the past we will start with one hundred bags. (I know where we can get more if need be). Take as many as you like and can afford to fill and bring to the parish hall by Sunday, October 29. We will transport the food to Caritas shortly after that. I have been impressed with your generosity in the past and know that I will be again this year.

EMC Synod

From October 12-14, the Episcopal Missionary Church will hold a Synod in Columbus, Ohio. St. Francis will be represented by four delegates including Father John and Wanda Stults, and two other delegates whose names I do not know at present. The Synod will vote to confirm Bishop Millsaps as our Presiding Bishop and welcome into the EMC fold a new diocese situated primarily in the northeastern portion of the country. Likewise there will be several ordinations, four to the diaconate and one to the priesthood, as well as the setting apart of a deaconess, as provided by our canons. Please pray for our delegates, for their role in the synod, and for the synod as a whole. While there is a good deal of fun to be had at such gatherings, there is also much business to be transacted, some of which may affect us in the time to come. I am sure that there will be a report from our delegates when they return.

Recently you received a survey form from the parish committee considering the possibility of relocation. If you have not yet done so, please fill out the survey and mail it back in the self-addressed, stamped envelope. As Father Stults said in his letter to you, it is important that we have as much input on the basic assumptions with which the committee is working so that they will know how to proceed. Christian Education classes for children and youth are in progress. Each Sunday morning, our younger generation gathers at 9:30 am in the Parish House.

She uses wonderful props so the children can see the story in action and asks questions that make the children think deeply about and how they fit in the story. Afterwards, in the Montessori style, the children choose their work. Some do several activities, while others only one. Each lesson ends with prayer and a snack. Please include our Sunday school program in our prayers.




