### FROM THE RECTOR:

Many of you have gotten to meet and speak with Father Peter of Baraka since he and his family and other parishioners have started regularly attending St. Francis. Many of you have also heard him preach on a couple of occasions. This past year St. Francis started supporting Baraka financially and the Vestry asked me to investigate whether we could be of further assistance to Baraka and Father Peter in his work in Austin.

On November 30, Claire Ducker, Nancy Critchfield-Jones and I met with Father Peter and two members of his congregation to hear an explanation of his ministry and to see if we could become involved on some level. Each Tuesday morning at 7:30 am Father Peter meets with a group of people at All Saints Episcopal Church at 27<sup>th</sup> and Whittis. Most but not all of the folks would be considered homeless and naturally have a good many physical needs. All Saints has a program that attempts to meet some of these on a material level. Father Peter meets with them before the All Saints program begins at 9:00 am to attempt to address their spiritual needs. He prays with them, reads Scripture with them and sometimes preaches to them. Afterwards he will speak with some of them about personal matters. One of the things that he would like to do but cannot because of his work schedule is to follow up with some of them at another time during the week.

Also, Father Peter conducts a Holy Communion service at one of the nursing homes in town (in fact, the one where he works) on the first Sunday of the month. This particular facility specializes in the treatment of Alzheimer patients, and therefore this service can sometimes be a bit challenging. He would like to have some help with those

patients who attend this ceremony.

If any of you might be interested in helping Father Peter in either one of these projects please see me and I will get you in touch with him. I know he would be grateful and the Kingdom of God would be advanced.

It is not unusual for a church to lose some members during the course of the year for any number of reasons including death. In 2007, Kevin McCommon, Bill Ducker and Elinor Doty left us for eternal life. Each of them in his or her own way touched us and left an imprint on us. We will all remember them in our own way and those closest to them will mourn their passing. But every member of a church community plays a role in it and these three did so in ours. We believe they are with God now and that should be of some comfort to the Christian. Their loved ones need our prayers for their grief as will the loved ones of those who will leave us this year. May they all rest in peace.

Besides getting to know such dear people of all ages and different religious beginnings who are now at St. Francis, I think the most important thing is I've made new friends who have the same love for God as I do.



After hearing him pray that prayer many times, someone asked him why he prayed that prayer so fervently.




