FROM THE RECTOR:

First of all I want to thank everyone who was involved in any way with the celebrations of Ordination and Confirmation. I am grateful, of course, to Bishop William Millsaps and Bishop Council Nedd for being with us over that weekend. It isn't possible to do ordinations or confirmations without a bishop. One of the things Bishop Millsaps said did strike me as important. The celebration of these and other sacraments is how we pass the church and the gospel to future generations. Therefore, they are extremely important in the life of any parish and in the life of the church at large.

I know that many of you spent a great deal of time preparing for these events. The cooking, the cleaning, the altar, the music, the video taping, the picture taking: all of these things were a necessary part of that weekend and I am proud and thankful for everyone's diligence in seeing that all went well. We have a great parish here at St. Francis.

March will seem somewhat tame by comparison with February. We are now in Lent and there should be a slower, more reflective and contemplative pace. If you have not availed yourself of some of the spiritual activities that are ongoing I would

encourage you to think about doing so. Every Tuesday at noon, the Anglican Rosary is prayed in our church. It only takes about one half hour. This might be a great Lenten devotion to practice.

If you were at the Lenten quiet day on February 28, you were taught the practice of Lectio Divina or Divine Reading. Try to spend some additional time on this to make this a continuous part of your life. Each Wednesday evening during Lent we pray the Stations of the Cross. You will recall that the Stations remind us of Jesus' passion and death and their necessity for our salvation. This Lent my reflections after the Stations will focus on the prayer that Jesus taught us, the one we call the Our Father. Last year our attendance on Wednesday evening was the best in my memory. Let's try to do even better this year. And don't forget Evening Prayer on Friday at 6:00 pm.

In addition to these public acts of prayer, our private prayer and acts of penance are also very important. For those of you who have Liturgical Calendars you will notice that we are called upon to fast and abstain during these days of penance. For most of us these concepts are so foreign that we tend to ignore them altogether. We know

that we are supposed to "give up something for Lent." But the deprivation should be somewhat significant so as to remind us that we are doing penance and remind us of the reason why we are doing penance, Don't waste another Lent. Try to enter into Jesus' passion so that you may joyfully celebrate His resurrection

Our bible study on Romans continues on Tuesday evening. If you have not been able to make it thus far, it's not too late. There's plenty of material in Romans at every stage of its development to provide you with food for thought and prayer.

A couple of important reminders! On Sunday, March 8, we will begin Daylight Saving time for 2009. Please set your clocks ahead one hour before you go to bed on Saturday night. On Sunday, March 29, the annual Capitol 10k will be held and traffic through our neighborhood will be compromised once again. If I am not mistaken, 15th Street/Enfield Road will be closed to traffic for most of the morning. Please use either 5th or 6th Street to get to church on Sunday, the 29th.

Thanks to all the parents who bring their children to Sunday school classes. New and returning students are always welcome. As always, please include our Sunday school in your prayers.


ANGLICANS for LIFE
