## **FROM THE RECTOR:**

#### First Pro-Life Sunday Huge Success

Sunday, September 20, was the first Pro-Life Sunday at St. Francis. Yes, we have had pro-life activities in the past and we have contributed to prolife activities around town and around the country. But we have never really had a specific day dedicated to Life.

We were blessed to have with us a group of students from the University of Texas, University Life Advocates, join us for lunch, an idea that sprung from our own Anglicans for Life group at St. Francis. In addition, two representatives from the Austin Coalition for Life were with us to explain and sign up volunteers for the fall campaign of 40 Days for Life. For 40 days, beginning September 23, volunteers will pray in front of two abortion facilities in Austin. Some volunteers are trained as sidewalk counselors who are able to assist women who are contemplating having an abortion. The ACL reps told us that they had more volunteers from St. Francis than a large Roman Catholic parish in southwest Austin. Thanks for stepping out to volunteer for this very important project in our city.

The University Life Advocates were represented by three young men and three young women from UT. Each talked a little about themselves and what they are doing school wise. Their leader, Caroline Camosey then gave a synopsis of what they are doing on the campus of the university to encourage people to rethink their position on abortion. We attempted to encourage them in their work since they are generally in hostile territory.

But I must tell you that I was encouraged to see these fine young people take a stand for truth. Thanks to Anglicans for Life and the men and women of the parish who prepared lunch for our guests. It was a great day for our parish.

#### **Upcoming Events**

As you well know our parish currently has two deacons. For the past eight months they have been under the supervision of Father John and me so that they might learn the ministerial ropes, so to speak. Part of their training is to preach the word of God during the liturgy. Therefore, beginning in October, both Deacon Tim Williams and Deacon Andrew Brummett will preach during at least one service each month. Bishop Millsaps has given them permission to preach and I have personally listened to them deliver a sermon. I was quite pleased with both the content and delivery of their sermons and I know that you will be edified as well.

In addition, Deacon Williams will lead a study on biblical interpretation on Tuesday evenings beginning October 6. There is more information on this in the newsletter further on. Also, Becky Hunt will lead a bible study for women beginning on October 1. There's also additional information in this newsletter as well as in the pew sheet. So, if you are looking for something to do this fall, there are at least a couple of options to think about.

#### **Fall Food Drive**

The annual fall parish food drive will begin on Sunday, October 4, the feast of St. Francis, and continue through the last Sunday of October.

The need for food contributions continues in the greater Austin area. The Storehouse in Pflugerville where the food the parish collected in May was taken had to close their doors recently for three days because they ran out of food. They have an unprecedented number of people requesting food, one of the very basic needs in life. St. Francis parishioners have been very generous with our food drives. Surely God has blessed you and will continue to do so since one can never out give the Lord. (Blessed is he that considers the poor, Psalm 41:1) Grocery bags will be placed in the back of church with a list of the items that are accepted by the Storehouse. ### **Christian Education for Children**

Praise be to God! Prayers are answered indeed. This year is off to a positive start!

Classes began with 5 in the teen class, 7 in the elementary aged class and 2 in the nursery. A warm welcome is extended to the Wathen family with three children in the younger class. It seems there are a couple of others in the wings who might join us.

The elementary area room was revamped for more children by removing the desk and the printer and rearranging the shelves. All the supplies were replenished and the shelves nicely arranged for the first day of classes. During the next month, this class will study a variety of Old Testament stories beginning with Noah, the Tower of Babel and several classes on Moses. The recurring theme through all the stories how God revealed himself to his chosen people and how they attempted to obey him. Each class includes prayer, song, an activity, and a feast.

The teenager class is ably led by Ellen Stults as they discuss the book of James. She is following

the Life Change Series study on this book. Each lesson goes into detail on a certain section with follow-up on how to apply what was said outside of the Sunday school class. Thanks to Ellen for doing this!

Thanks to Elaine Williams for organizing a team of women to watch the youngest ones in the nursery -- most are siblings of a child in the elementary class.

The St. Francis part of Operation Christmas Child project will begin during the month of October. For the past 8 years, our Sunday school has taken on this project of wrapping shoe boxes and filling them with items children around the world would appreciate. It has worked well for us to ask for donations of the items to fill the boxes. We ask that you purchase several of the same item -- several boxes of crayons, several small stuffed animals -- and bring to the church by November 15. The children and youth then pack the boxes and they are taken to a drop off location during the week. Expect a letter within the next couple of weeks with a list of items needed for the boxes.

Please continue to lift up our Sunday school program in prayer.

Beginning the evening of October 6, at 7 pm, Deacon Tim will be teaching a class on the history of Biblical interpretation. We will move into Patristic interpretation (including the monastic tradition and Lectio Divina). Time permitting, we will discuss interpretation in the Anglican tradition. Throughout the class we will look at various examples of Biblical interpretation and discuss them. The goal of the course is very simple – to help us become better Bible readers. which in turn will help us appreciate the amazing gift we have in Scripture. The course will be six weeks long and all are invited.
