Get Out and Vote

As most of you know, the mid-term elections will be held on Tuesday, November 2. Early voting will begin this month probably around the 17th or 18th. Turnout in these mid-term elections is always lighter than in the years when we elect a president. Some people apparently don't think these elections are as important. However, every single U.S. Representative will stand for election and one-third of the United States Senate. So, even though the executive branch will remain the same for at least another two years, the Congress of the United States may change drastically. And we all have a say in how these elections turn out. It seems to me that each successive election is more important than the last. The direction of the country is at stake in every one of these elections. Please don't disregard this election. It is simply too important to the welfare of the nation.

Pro-Life Course available soon

The Anglicans for Life group at St. Francis has seen fit to invest in an eight week video course developed by the national Anglicans for Life organization. Our plan it to make this available to the entire parish as soon as it is feasible. As I mentioned to you in my sermon on September 19, it is not enough to state that you are pro-life. I am hoping that this series will help us get a better handle on what it means to be pro-life in a very practical way. It is also my hope that the information contained in this series will be valuable to you to help you form cogent arguments in response to much of the misinformation that seems to be available in the market place. I do not know at this time when we will have the course, but we hope to make it available as soon as possible. We'll keep you informed

On a related matter, 40 Days for Life continues through the end of October. Thanks to all of you who signed up to participate in the prayer vigils this fall. After the signup on 9/19, one of the volunteers from the Austin Coalition for Life joined us for our Anglicans for Life meeting. Ruben Ollervides is a member of the leadership team of the organization. I think all of us were impressed not only by the depth of his commitment to the cause of life, but his deep, humble spirituality in general. Having met a number of their leadership team over the years I can tell you that Ruben is not alone. These people are praying, fasting, devoted Christians who believe God has called them to take on this very difficult ministry. I have been impressed with them and with the leadership of other pro-life ministries in Austin. Many of them are young, dynamic individuals whose leadership skills go far beyond their years. God is obviously with them. And we should be, too.

Finally, The Episcopal Missionary Church will meet in Synod from October 21-23. Fr. John and Wanda Stults will represent St. Francis at the Synod. Please keep this meeting in your prayers.

Sunday School News

Classes successfully began on Sept. 12 with both the youth and the younger classes have six students each. Oddly enough, just about everyone is a different age. (I am not quite sure how that happened.) The nursery has 3-4 younger siblings who may come into the younger class this year. Thanks to Rebecca Hoard for organizing the nursery. A big welcome goes to Mason Jensen for attending Sunday school for the first time this year and to Sam Wathan who moved from being the oldest by a couple of years in the younger class to being the youngest by a couple of years in the Youth class. Our two classes just about couldn't be more different.

As stated in the previous newsletter, the older class is discussing heresies. This was a new concept to a couple of the students, so gaining a new understanding of old and rehashed heresies is the goal. Thanks to Mike Ready for leading these students. The elementary aged class is working through Old Testament stories as laid out by the One Room Sunday School program published by Abingdon Press. The suggested activities for the stories are most helpful when an otherwise harried teacher plans the lesson, not to mention Fr. Len's take on what the children should learn from the stories of David from the boy Shepherd state to the King.

A new activity is for me to repeat the elementary lesson on most Sunday afternoons with the children who attend Baraka. I have been hearing that voice in the back of my head saying I needed to do this for too long and decided to act on it. It is interesting teaching four eager, well behaved children with only two of them old enough to speak with you. I am thankful that Fr. Peter's daughters are there to help out. I am looking forward to combining the two young classes together for the Christmas pageant.

The Operation Christmas Child letter with list of items needed for the boxes will go out in October. Our packing date is November 15. What is needed now are shoeboxes with a lid that separates

from the box and that once held women's dress shoes or sandals. Athletic or men's shoe boxes are larger than what is needed. These will be collected in the Sunday school room.
