FROM THE RECTOR:

Advent and Christmas

We are now already in another season of Advent. During Advent we hear about the Lord's coming. The Scriptures are filled with prophecies about the Messiah and how that will make such a difference in the lives of the people, not only the people of Israel but all the people of the world. But the Messiah has already come and even though He has made a remarkable difference in the lives of all who believe in Him, there is still expectation and wonder about how it will be when He comes in glory. While we are waiting it is important that we "wait in joyful hope" for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The use of Advent wreaths during Advent provide us with the opportunity to remember not only that He has come but that He will come again, and to adjust our lives accordingly.

Our Christmas Eve service of Lessons and Carols followed by Holy Communion will begin at 8:00 p.m. There will also be a Holy Communion service at 10:00 am on Christmas morning for those who are unable to attend the night before. Try to resist the temptation and . celebrate Christmas and the Sunday after Christmas, which is the feast of St. Stephen.

Our annual Christmas decorating party will be on Tuesday evening, December 21 at 7:00 p.m. The decorating part of this doesn't take very long and there is usually a lot of fun and some singing of carols as well. So please try to join us.

The Advent and Christmas season are usually quite busy and often times any number of things may happen to take us out of our festive mood. The following are some words of wisdom from a modern day saint to remind us of where our priorities really lie.
