FROM THE RECTOR:

First of all I want to thank everyone who participated in the planning and execution of the Holy Week and Easter services. I know that lots of folks spent lots of time working to make things beautiful for the Lord and I am deeply appreciative.

We will be in the Easter season for the next several weeks and it is my hope the joy and enthusiasm with which we celebrate Easter can continue in our celebrations but also in our lives as well. I know that it is not easy to keep that "high" going and I am not suggesting that being on that high is always necessary. But the early Christians greeted each other with the phrase "He is risen." These words said it all for them. It meant not only His life but theirs was changed forever. Let's keep the joy of the Lord's resurrection going in our parish and in everything we do.
